

Report on Training Session: Writing an Abstract and Understanding Research Ethics

Introduction:

On February 2nd, 2022, Saffrony Institute conducted a training session focused on writing an abstract and understanding research ethics. 45 students attended the session. Led by Prof. Akshay Kansara, the session aimed to equip 6th-semester students with essential skills for preparing research and review papers, emphasizing the importance of ethical conduct in research.

Session Overview:

2. Understanding Research Ethics:

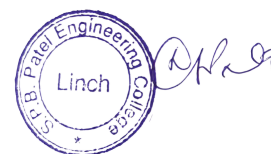
- Ethical Principles in Research: Students were introduced to fundamental ethical principles governing research conduct, including honesty, integrity, transparency, and respect for participants' rights.
