Celebration of Generosity:

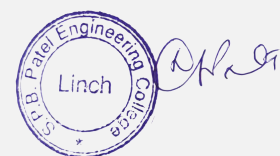

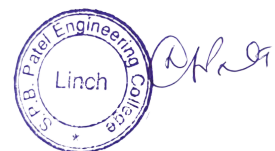
Conclusion

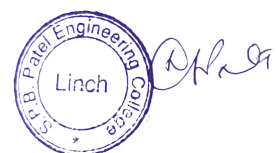

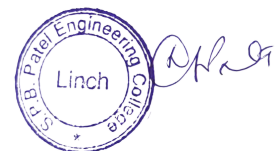

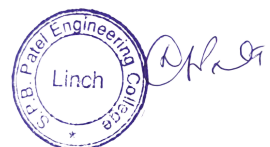
Outcomes and Achievements:

- Introduction and welcome by school authorities.

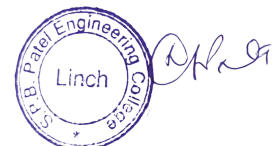
2. Time: 9:30 AM - 10:00 AM

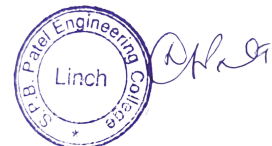

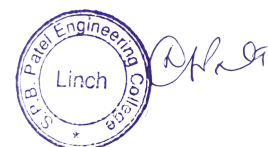
Activity Overview:

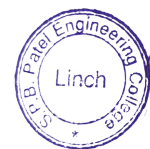

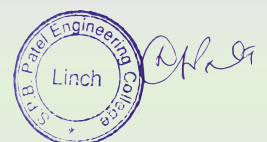

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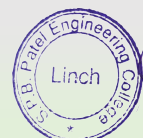

Event Process:

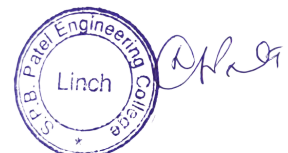
1. Registration and Briefing (10:30 am - 10:45 am):

5. Conclusion and Refreshments (12:45 pm - 1:00 pm):

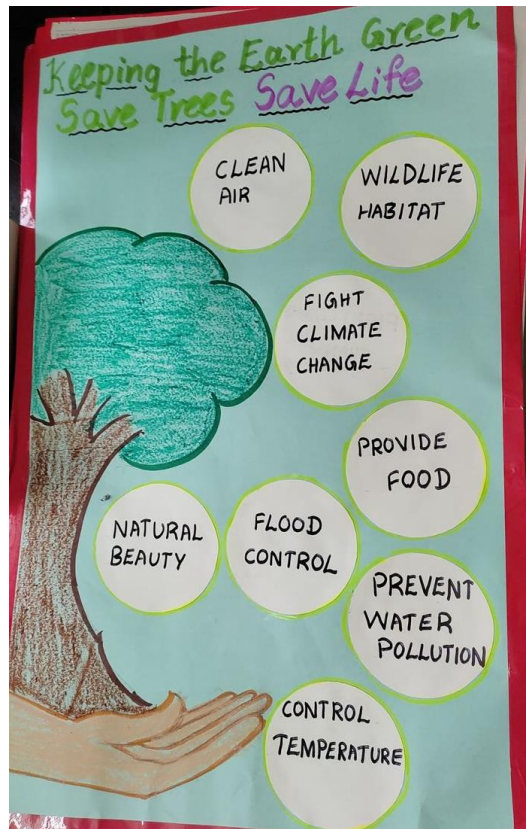
- The event concluded with a brief acknowledgment of the participants' efforts and dedication.

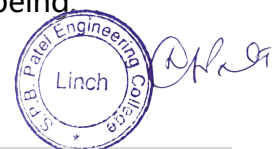

Impact and Recognition:

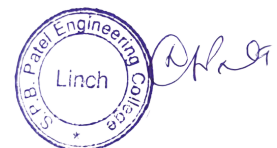

This extension activity reflects Saffrony's continued commitment to community service and awareness. The institute remains dedicated to extending its positive impact


